

NC Choices Releases Video Series on Processing Local Meats in NC

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Raleigh, NC: NC Choices, an initiative of the Center for Environmental Farming Systems that promotes the advancement of local, niche and pasture-based meat supply chains, has released a six-part video series on processing local meat products in NC. The videos are intended to illustrate some of the services available at small-scale processing facilities that can add marketability to farmers selling local meat products.

"We want to help demystify meat processing so that our producers can take full advantage of the services offered. Whether it's through developing videos or larger networking events like the Carolina Meat Conference in October, NC Choices' goal is to facilitate profitable business decisions for farmers and processors advancing local and pasture-based meats," said NC Choices Program Manager Sarah Blacklin.
